Career History

Tom Bowden has recently retired as Chief Executive Officer of HealthLink Ltd, which he co-founded in 1993 under an agreement with the New Zealand Government. Realising that development of complex electronic communications systems for healthcare would require specialist expertise; the New Zealand Government sought out companies with whom it could form public-private partnerships.

Over a 25 year period, HealthLink has developed a range of communications systems and services that are used by 15,000 New Zealand and Australian health sectors organizations to exchange more than 100 million items of clinical information annually.

As one of the largest health information exchanges in the world, HealthLink provides technical support for a wide range of New Zealand government owned and operated data facilities and health management programmes. In Australia, HealthLink has had in place HIE (health information exchange) services used by six state and territory governments. HealthLink is the largest health information sector Integrator in either Australia or New Zealand.

Tom exited the company early in 2019.

Tom Bowden specializes in developing information technology integration strategy and policy for healthcare systems. He has been involved in performing a series of international health system comparisons and he has performed consulting assignments for government healthcare agencies in Australia, Canada and Denmark. Tom Bowden has been chairman of Health Informatics New Zealand (HINZ). New Zealand's peak informatics body, HINZ is a broadly based industry association with more than 500 members. He was Deputy Chairman for the previous four years prior to assuming the chair. Tom is currently Deputy President of the Australian Medical Software Industry Association, a role he has held since 2017.

Prior to founding HealthLink in 1993, Tom worked in the telecommunications and computing Industries, in senior management roles, following completion of a Master's Degree in Business Administration (focusing on the transition of paper based to electronic communications processes) in 1987.
